SUNDAY REFLECTION FROM FR. BRENDAN'S DESK

As a child, like most kids in my generation, I would wake up early on Saturdays to watch Saturday morning cartoons. One of my favorite shows was Transformers, those alien robots that looked like ordinary cars and trucks, until they would transform into the robot warriors that they really were. The tagline for the show was, "Transformers: More than meets the eye." And that was true. The robots were these, well, weird alien robots, they only looked like cars and trucks. You had to see beneath the surface to tell what was going on.

In a lot of ways, we see that in the Gospel that we hear today, the Transfiguration of the Lord. Jesus takes three of his disciples to the top of Mount Tabor. Going up the mountain is significant in Scripture. Prophets would go "up the mountain" to be closer to God. Jesus took three of his disciples up the mountain to show them what was really going on. He was showing them who he really is and what God's kingdom is really like. We see Jesus transfigured; he becomes a divine-looking figure. We see the prophets Moses and Elijah, prophets long dead, physically present with Jesus. Then we hear the voice of the invisible Father.

What do we see in this scene? We see heaven being made visible on Earth. We see that, even as Jesus takes on our human nature, he is God himself. We see the communion of saints. We see that death is not the end of life, but rather that, in Jesus, God has transformed it into a new beginning and a way towards a more perfect way of existing, not a lesser one. Then we hear the voice of the Father saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." Think about what we just heard. Not only do we hear the Father's voice, but he shows us what heaven is. It is a communion of love.

After all, what greater thing could a father say to a son that, "This is my beloved, with whom I am well pleased?" Not only does he identify Jesus as his son, but he shows us that, to quote St. John's first letter, God is love. God is love itself. That is a love that cannot be lessened by time or by space. That love, that reality of love that binds all of God's children, is ever-present, even if we don't fully see it. We don't always see the full reality of God's love. But it is there, guiding us and holding us in being. It is something that we need God to reveal to us, and we must carry the memory with us when we encounter the daily struggles of our world.



Jako dziecko, jak większość rówieśników z mojego pokolenia, wstawałem wcześniej w soboty, aby oglądać bajki w sobotnie poranki. Jednym z moich ulubionych programów byli Transformers, roboty, które wyglądały jak zwykle samochody i ciężarówki, dopóki nie przekształciły się w robotów-wojowników. Motto programu brzmiało: „Transformers: Więcej niż na pierwszy rzut oka”. I to była prawda. Roboty były tymi, coż, dziwnymi robotami z kosmosu, tylko wyglądały jak samochody i ciężarówki. Trzeba było zajrzeć pod powierzchnię, żeby wiedzieć, co się dzieje.

Na wiele sposobów widzimy to w Ewangelii, którą dziś słyszymy, Przemienienie Pańskie. Jezus zabiera trzech swoich uczniów na szczyt góry Tabor. Wejście na górę jest znaczące w Piśmie Świętym. Prorocy szli „na górę”, aby być bliżej Boga. Jezus zabrał trzech swoich uczniów na górę, aby pokazać im, co się naprawdę dzieje. Pokazywał im, kim naprawdę jest i jak naprawdę wygląda królestwo Boże. Widzimy przemienionego Jezusa; staje się postacią o Boskim wyglądzie. Widzimy proroków Mojżesza i Eliasza, dawno zmarłych, fizycznie obecnych z Jezusem. Wtedy słyszymy głos niewidzialnego Ojca.

Co widzimy w tej scenie? Niebo staje się widoczne na Ziemi. Widzimy, że Jezus, przyjmując naszą ludzką naturę, jest samym Bogiem. Widzimy obcowanie świętych. Widzimy, że śmierć nie jest końcem życia, ale raczej, że w Jezusie Bóg przekształcił je w nowy początek i drogę ku doskonalszemu, a nie gorszemu sposobowi istnienia. Wtedy słyszymy głos Ojca mówiący: „To jest mój Syn umiłowany, w którym mam upodobanie; Słuchajcie Go.” Pomyśl o tym, co właśnie usłyszeliśmy. Nie tylko słyszymy głos Ojca, ale On pokazuje nam, czym jest niebo. To komunია miłości.

W końcu czyż może być coś wspanialszego, co ojciec mógłby powiedzieć: „To jest mój syn umiłowany, w którym mam upodobanie?” Nie tylko identyfikuje Jezusa jako swojego syna, ale pokazuje nam, że, cytując pierwszy list św. Jana, Bóg jest miłością. Bóg jest samą miłością. To jest miłość, której nie może osłabić ani czas, ani przestrzeń. Ta miłość, ta rzeczywistość miłości, która łączy wszystkie dzieci Boże, jest zawsze obecna, nawet jeśli jej w pełni nie dostrzegamy. Nie zawsze widzimy pełną rzeczywistość Bożej miłości. Ale ono tam jest, prowadzi nas i utrzymuje w istnieniu. Jest to coś, co Bóg musi nam objawić i musimy nosić tę pamięć ze sobą, gdy napotykamy codzienne zmagania naszego świata.

Dear Parishioners, Benefactors and Friends of Mary, Undoer of Knots Parish,

Enclosed is a financial report from July 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 which includes both the actual numbers and the budget numbers for this period. The Parish results and the School financial results are for the same period.

NET ORDINARY CHURCH OPERATIONS:

Areas that exceed budget are: Sunday/Holy Day collection, Religious Ed. Tuition/Fees, Other Collections, and Miscellaneous Income. Areas that fall short of budget are: Christmas collections, Fund Raising, and Investment Income. Investment fluctuations have been greater than was expected when the budget was created last year. Total church ordinary income is \$13,741 higher than budget.

The budget numbers included one additional person for health insurance, and possible unemployment which is included in professional growth. Utilities and Maintenance expenses were based on history and projected costs for known situations. Expenses continue to be closely monitored. Total church ordinary expenses are \$34,915 less than budget.

Net church income is a surplus of \$68,126 which is \$48,656 better than the budget projection. Some of the variations are caused by timing differences. For example, the fund raising budget numbers anticipated a fund raising event before year end where the timing is now in March of 2023.

CHURCH EXTRAORDINARY INCOME (EXPENSES):

Church extraordinary income is primarily Arch Required Second Collections and a bequest. Fund collections are the monies that are still coming in from To Teach Who Christ Is. The payout of the Second Collections is reported under extraordinary expenses. Capital improvements relate to the boiler work at the St. Constance Convent and Rectory. The Convent boiler replacement is being funded by TTWCI funds which are on deposit at the Archdiocesan Bank.

ST. ROBERT BELLARMINE SCHOOL:

The school operated at a net surplus of \$124,903. Compared to the budget, this net surplus is \$2,058 less than the budget amount. There were offsetting differences in school income and school expenses.





ON CONVERSATIONS

A former pastor at my home parish is a marathoner, and many years ago--before he was promoted to bishop and got a new gig--we used to run together once a week. We ran at dawn, so our parish grade school principal, who always arrived very early to work, would sometimes see the two of us as we were finishing up a run. After several such sightings, she asked me something about my miles with the pastor that tickled me, and that I've never forgotten: "What do you guys talk about?"



Well... Work, family, God. A beautiful sunrise. I haven't thought about this for a while, but it comes to mind now as I consider today's Gospel, the Transfiguration of Jesus. Today we hear Matthew's version, and prompting my memory of the principal's question is something Peter, James, and John witness up on that mountain. Jesus is transfigured, yes, but also, "...behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him." Uh...What do you guys talk about?

We get no insight in today's passage. The Evangelist Mark offers a similar account of the scene and doesn't address the conversational topic either, just "Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus." Only Luke spells it out, writing that Jesus is telling Moses and Elijah "...of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem." I'm guessing that Jesus is referring here to his upcoming death, resurrection and ascension.

Very good. But I think there might be a little sidebar conversation going on as well. And I think this only because of the three players involved, and something that I remember reading elsewhere in the Book. I had to look it up just now to be sure, but it's something that Jesus says when that Pharisee asks him about the greatest commandment. Remember? Jesus answers that the greatest commandment is to love God, and the second is to love our neighbor as self, but then he adds something very important: "The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

OK... Who is the consummate law-giver of the Old Testament? Moses. He went up the mountain and came down with the tablet, after all, then laid down the law for the Israelites. And who is the consummate prophet of the Old Testament? One could argue (and I do): Elijah. He took on those four hundred and fifty prophets of Baal, after all, then went on the run and heard that tiny whispering sound on Horeb, the mountain of God. And Jesus himself said from the get-go that he didn't come to abolish the law, but to fulfill it...

Well, there you go! The sidebar conversation must have something to do with Jesus being the beginning and the end--which is really just the beginning--of all that the law and the prophets had been pointing to for centuries. And as such, Moses and Elijah are there to acknowledge that this Jesus, the Christ, is, ultimately, everything. Or, as a Transfiguration footnote in my Book puts it in more scholarly fashion, the two are there "...as witnesses to the fulfillment of the law and the prophets taking place in the person of Jesus as he appears in his glory." What do you guys talk about? Hmmmm. Maybe work, family, God, and a beautiful sunrise isn't too far off.


